The county's Zoning Administrator has approved an Administrative Permit for a Bonsall family to operate a pair of horse barns on their Aqueduct Road property.

The decision of Zoning Administrator Rose Garduno will stand if not reversed on appeal. Neighbors Jaime and Dawne Clayton will likely carry out an appeal to the county's Planning Commission, and the Planning Commission's decision can subsequently be appealed to the San Diego County Board of Supervisors.

Board approves raise for classified staff

After being sworn in as trustees of the Fallbrook Union High School District on Monday night, Bill O'Connor, Michael Schulte and Marc Steffler joined Dennis Allen and Lynn Colburn in unanimously approving the Collective Bargaining Agreement between the district and SEIU Local 2028 (classified employees union).

At a cost of \$431,066 to the district for the 2005-2006 and 2006-2007 school years, the agreement is subject to renegotiation insofar as salary, benefits and one other mutually agreed upon item for the 2007-2008 year.

Parade kept deputies busier this year

Deputy Robert Heitmach, Special Event Coordinator for the Sheriff's Department Fallbrook Substation, said the 2006 Fallbrook Christmas Parade went off "really well" as far as the planning and logistics but said the event was busier this year for law enforcement personnel.

"We've never had this many calls before from the parade, but it was manageable," he said.

The incident that gained the most attention occurred just as the parade ended when a group of ten young gang members disturbed spectators in the vicinity of Main Avenue and Fallbrook Street. The group was walking down the east side of Main, getting in people's way, challenging them, Heitmach said. "We dispatched a unit to make contact with these kids."

Heitmach said the young teens clothing with bandanas on their shoulders, which can indicate gang affiliation. "They were probably trying to intimidate people by the way they dressed; they were
